

## GRADUATION RATES

The most recent Graduation Rates for the students starting and graduating within the 100% (2yrs), 150% (3yrs), and 200% (4yrs) window of the published times for the Associates and Bachelor’s Programs are as follows:

We had no Bachelor’s graduates who enrolled for the 1st time within this window.

As a non-traditional school with an average of 90% part-students, the graduation rates are highly impacted by the elongation of the education timeline. With the average Carver student enrollment of five-six credit hours per semester, the traditional graduation rate is not readily attainable.

In addition, not all undergraduate Carver students are pursuing a degree. Some students come to Carver with secular, undergraduate and master’s degrees, but are hungry to be well-prepared in Bible, theology, enhanced ministry skills, and leadership in the local church. Other students come for specific ministry skills such as counseling and Christian education. It will be important in the future to separate the degree-seeking student data from that of the non-degree-seeking students to enable more specific reporting.

In the last 10 years (from the fall of 2012 to the spring of 2023), Carver has awarded 33 degrees: 14 Bachelor's degrees, and 19 Associate degrees. Of the 14 students who received Bachelor's degrees, one completed his degree within 4 years (100% of the time to complete a Bachelor's degree). Two of the 14 completed their degree within 8 years (200% of the time). The average time for the 14 students to receive their degree was 12.5 years.

Of the 19 students who received Associates degrees, one completed his degree within two years (100% of the time to complete an Associates degree). One completed his degree within 3 years (150% of the given time). Two other students completed their degree within 4 years (200% of the time). The average time for these 19 students to complete their degree was 7.8 years.

These 14 Bachelor's degrees and 19 Associates degrees are not all reflected in the above charts because several of these degree recipients enrolled at Carver for the first time before the fall of 2012.

Of the 81 students enrolled for the first time from the spring of 2013 to the spring of 2023, 10 students received degrees (8 received AA degrees and 2 received AA and BA degrees).  
 $10/81=12.3\%$ .
